- 1. God-Centered Therapy: In order for Recovery Therapy to be deeply effective and lasting, it must have the person of Jesus Christ at the center and offer the individual growing intimacy with Him.**

Our intimacy with God is His highest priority for our lives and determines the impact of our lives. Where there is an intimate relationship with God, there is the power to break the stronghold of all addictions.

- 2. Loving Family Environment: It is essential, in order for recovery to be most effective, to take place in the context of loving family relationships.**

The need for strong, healthy, uplifting and supportive family ties is a universal God-given need. God passes down blessings through healthy, loving families. In this generation, God's intended purpose for the family has become corrupted and has caused people to seek unhealthy family replacements elsewhere. This has resulted in people turning to gangs, the streets, and other counterfeit family solutions to meet their need for family. The only true and effective alternative to a dysfunctional family or lack of a family is a spiritual family dedicated to living under the principles of God.

- 3. The Holy Bible is God's Word. It is inspired by God and every word in it is true. It contains everything needed to influence the mind, will, emotions, soul and spirit, and when read under the influence and guidance of the Holy Spirit changes lives.**

The origin of Drug, Alcohol and Addiction Counseling in our society is based in Scripture. The 12 Steps of Alcoholics Anonymous came from Biblical principles. Everything that is effective and good in the fields of Psychology and Recovery Counseling is found in Scripture, while everything that is harmful and ineffective found in these fields of study are warned against in Scripture.
